New Business

Proposed Budget 2022-2023

Approved the 2022-2023 proposed budget for publication and established July 6, 2022 at 7:30 pm as the date and time to hold a public hearing and vote for adoption related to the budget.

Nate Bowler, Chief Financial Officer explained this is an optimistic preliminary budget since the Arizona State Legislature has not adopted a budget but we are required by Statute to propose, publish a proposed budget and call for a public hearing. He further explained that we are allowed to decrease the budget but not allowed to increase after we receive the approved budget from the Legislature.

President Kennedy asked how it affected us if the Legislature did not pass a budget. Mr. Bowler explained this has happened before and we would just proceed without a budget from the Legislature. Superintendent Capistran commented on the fact the Legislature had attempted to pass a "skinny budget" but was unsuccessful.

President Kennedy and Board Member Reicks asked for clarification on the comparison for teacher salaries. Mr. Bowler reported GUHSD's average teacher salary is 74,900 compared to the State's average of \$56,349.
